## **BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN PRE-LAW AND PUBLIC POLICY**

## **Description**

The Bachelor of Science in Pre-Law and Public Policy degree is a postsecondary professional degree designed to equip students to pursue a graduate-level law degree and/or prepare for a career in public service, government, business, or other leadership position. This program requires a high school diploma or equivalency certificate, an ACT or SAT score, and the completion of 120 semester hours of academic credit for graduation

### **Completion Requirements**

To qualify for graduation from Mid-America College, each student seeking the Bachelor of Science in Pre-Law and Public Policy degree must satisfy the general requirements for graduation as set forth in this catalog.

#### **General Education Requirements**

Students seeking the Bachelor of Science in Pre-Law and Public Policy degree are required to complete a minimum of 33 semester hours of general education courses that includes courses in each of the following three areas: the humanities or fine arts, the social or behavioral sciences, and the natural sciences or mathematics. General education courses may be transferred from anotherpostsecondaary institution, or they may be completed within the required course structure of the Bachelor of Science in Pre-Law and Public Policy degree.
